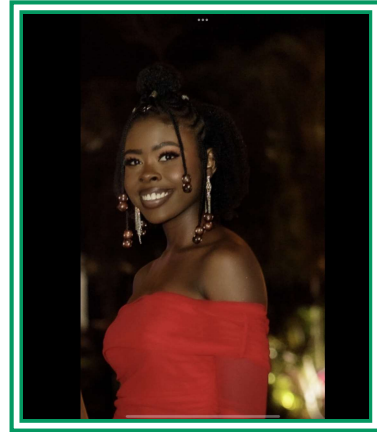
1. Our first **DCM** will take place via zoom on Sunday **June 18th from 4-5pm**. Please RSVP by June 16th at the [RSVP link](#).

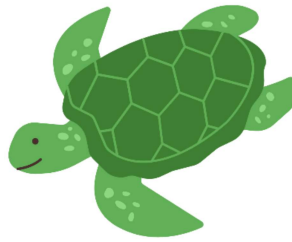
Thank you to all who attended; I truly appreciated seeing all of you there and cannot wait for our next meeting!
