Currently, The Major Emphasis Programs Committee is working on publicizing "The ELIMINATE Project." This program is the newest Worldwide Service Project introduced by UNICEF and Kiwanis International on June 24, 2010 at the Kiwanis International Convention in Las Vegas, NV. The ELIMINATE Project works towards eliminating Maternal/Neonatal Tetanus which claims the lives of nearly 90,000 babies and mothers yearly. The goal of this project is to reach the poorest countries of the world to Eliminate MNT from the world, forever. Together, with the help of Key Clubbers, UNICEF and Kiwanis plan to raise over \$110 million to help stop this completely preventable disease. As Key Club members, you are encouraged to host fundraisers and raise awareness about MNT. So, get out there and host carwashes, have bake sales, or maybe even just posters and signs about how easy MNT is to eliminate. Help UNICEF and Kiwanis reach their goal to stop MNT by 2015.
