

With the beginning of the 2022-23 year, keep in mind your club will begin to collect dues.

**Dues are \$13.00 (\$6 for the District and \$7 for International) per member, this converts to \$10 CI** and your club is welcome to increase these dues to cover club t-shirts or additional costs, per the club bylaws.

It is *highly* recommended that you submit dues by the <u>Early Bird Deadline</u>, <u>November 1st</u>. Submitting by then allows your club to qualify for the Early Bird Dues Patch! The <u>Regular Dues Deadline is December 1st</u>.

Dues will be paid through the Membership Update Center (MUC). The club treasurer and faculty advisor have access to the Membership Update Center. Please remember to update your rosters by deleting all the members that are no longer in your club and adding in all your new members.

The Membership Update Center (MUC) will open for the 2022-23 year in early <u>September</u> and active clubs will be able to update membership records for the new year and begin receiving new member supplies. Multiple payments of dues are acceptable and encouraged.


