Dues Information

With the beginning of the 2023-2024 year, keep in mind your club should begin to collect dues.

Dues are \$14.00 (\$7 for the District and \$7 for International) per member, and your club is welcome to increase these dues to cover club t-shirts or additional costs, per your club bylaws.

It is *highly* recommended that you submit dues by the <u>Early Bird Deadline</u>, <u>November 1st</u>. Submitting by then allows your club to qualify for the Early Bird Dues Patch! The <u>Regular Dues Deadline</u> is <u>December 1st</u>.

The Membership Update Center (MUC) will open for the 2023-24 year in early September and active clubs will be able to update membership records for the new year and begin receiving new member supplies.


