The Florida Opportunity Fund (FLOF) is a grant for service projects available only in the Florida District of Key Club International. FLOF can give clubs up to 2/3 the money necessary for service projects; however, schools must provide the rest. You can receive ranges from \$100 to \$1,000. Your club must be in good standing.


Youth Opportunity Fund
