Florida Key Club Endowment Fund


Dear Key Club Members,

The Florida District of Key Club International, Inc., is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. Last year's District Board approved the establishment of an Endowment and set aside funds to support scholarships and grants which will begin this year. In fact, students may apply for more college scholarships than ever before from the Florida District of Key Club International, Inc. In the future, it is hoped that this endowment could help reduce the cost of the annual District Education and Leadership Conference (DCON), which could make it possible for many more members to attend.

Your current District Board created the Endowment Committee. This committee has been charged with helping to find ways of raising tax deductible monetary gifts in support of this fund, and establishing criteria ideas for granting funds to deserving students, clubs, divisions and projects.

The long-term goal is to raise US\$1 million in the next five years. The committee will be publishing marketing materials throughout the 2015-2016 administrative year, so be on the lookout for more details explaining how members, clubs, and families may both help and benefit from our endowment.
