Host a Talent Show



This will need time and serious planning. Just like tournaments, be sure to have good prizes.

Create a calendar

Develop a theme for a special calendar. Approach a printer about offering a discount for printing the calendar and offer the printer advertising on the calendar. After the calendars have been printed, sell the calendars to parents, local businesses, etc. The price of the calendar should cover the printing and allow for more funds to support the club.
