

TRICK-OR-TREAT FOR UNICEF

UNICEF is partnered with Kiwanis for The Eliminate Project. The Eliminate Project is focused on eradicating Maternal Neonatal Tetanus (MNT)

Globally. Maternal Neonatal Tetanus is a deadly disease that affects a mother and child during birth, resulting in painful convulsions and sensitivity to light and touch. A baby dies every 15 minutes from MNT, and thus, 35,040 babies lives are lost annually alongside with a significant number of women.

Luckily this disease is easily preventable! However, due to UNICEF needing more fundings to reach women in areas in less accessible, the price of the vaccinations have raised from \$1.80 to \$3.00. This amount is still affordable!

School's Bulletin: If your school has a newsletter, ask if Key Club can have a spot (as big as a page or even as small as a corner) to talk about Key Club!


Posters: Keep your school community updated with the events taking place by putting up posters on the walls, or even in classrooms.


The Florida District Education & Leadership Convention (DCON) is the biggest event of the Key Club year!

Why should a club pay dues?

- A Key Club must pay dues in order to be in good standing with Key Club International, be eligible for awards, attend DCON, and more.
- Payments of dues to Key Club International is a requirement for a student to be considered as a Key Club member.

Steps to Pay Club Dues

- 1. Click on the button below.
- 2. Use your advisor's email address and password that your advisor set up to log in.
- 3. After you're logged in, enter the club secretary's information and designate them as such by going to the "Dashboard" tab.
- 4. At this point, the secretary can log in with his/her own email, access the "Members" tab, and add or edit the information for all members (for example, delete graduated seniors).
- 5. Your club membership is completely updated, print the invoice by going to the "Finance" tab and give hand the invoice with the dues over to the Kiwanis Club of Grand Cayman and they will deal with the rest for you.

Note that not all club members must be paid for at one time. You can generate multiple invoices throughout the year and pay for members as they join the club.

Florida Opportunity Fund & Youth Opportunity Fund

The **Florida Opportunity Fund (FLOF)** is a grant for service projects only available in the Florida District. FLOF can give clubs up to 2/3 of the money necessary for service projects; however, schools must provide 1/3 of the amount they wish to receive.

The amount of money you can get ranges from \$100 to \$1,000. Your club must be in good standing, meaning it has submitted most Pride Reports on time, completed the OIF, paid dues, and is active in service projects and divisional/district events.

The applications for the 2019-2020 year will open soon so start planning ahead!

The Youth Opportunity Fund (YOF) grants are Key Clubs and/or individual club members. Grant amounts between \$100 to \$2,000 may be requested and applications must be submitted online by October 15 at 11:59 PM, EST.
