Outfit your community

One fantastic way to help local families in need is to organize, volunteer for, or donate by hosting a clothing drive at your schools. You can talk to your school leaders about local women and children's shelters such as Estella's Place and Red Cross by simply taking inventory of gently used clothing that no longer fits you or your siblings and bring it to one of the organizations below.

5. Fundraising Ideas

Host a tournament.

It can be basketball, softball, video game, pool, volleyball—any type of tournament! Have an entrance fee for individuals or teams. Advertising the tournament is the key to success of this event—start at least two months before. Be sure to have great prizes for those who win. You need to give an incentive for people who pay to enter a tournament.

Host a Talent Show


Many organizations host talents show for people to watch. Consider incorporating a television show theme like Dancing with the Stars, American Idol, So You Think You Can Dance, America's Got Talent, etc. Do not forget to recruit judges! This will need time and serious planning. Just like tournaments, be sure to have good prizes.

Create a calendar

Develop a theme for a special calendar. Approach a printer about offering a discount for printing the calendar and offer the printer advertising on the calendar. After the calendars have been printed, sell the calendars to parents, local businesses, etc. The price of the calendar should cover the printing and allow for more funds to support the club.

6. Key Club Kick Off Conference

Key Club Kickoff Conference (KCKC) is coming up on October 27, 2018. It is a training conference for new officers, as well as an event to learn about Key Club and the rest of the Kiwanis Family. The KCKC will take place from 1 pm to 5 pm at Cayman Prep and High School. All officers, members, faculty advisors and Kiwanis advisors are encouraged to attend.



7. Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF

As a part of the Florida District's goal of \$105,000 US to raise for the Eliminate Project, the Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF Committee has created a goal for each member to raise or donate. Five dollars. That is, it! If each member of Key Club raises at least US \$5, then we will easily meet our goal and surpass it!

Because of this goal, below is a chart of each club's member count and how much their club would raise if everyone raised US \$5 then the total of each.



Call your local stores and try to schedule a meeting with the manager. If you cannot visit the stores due to transportation issues, communicating through call is an excellent alternative.
